From 71: Take exit 15, Turn Left onto Pfeiffer Road. Follow Pfeiffer (which turns into Glendale Milford Road at Reed Hartman Highway) west 3 miles; turn left onto Reading Road. Turn left at the third light, 0.6 miles south of Glendale-Milford Road. Be sure to look for the Gorman Heritage Farm sign!

### WINTER EVENT

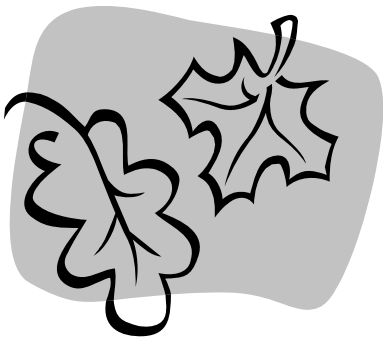
**Seventh Annual Winter Dinner**
